MAKING A DAGUERREOTYPE OF THE GEORGE EASTMAN HOUSE, October 1, 1973

Irving Pobboravsky, assisted by William Peterson, makes a four-minute exposure on a 5" x 7" plate using a Giroux camera. This camera is from the collection of the International Museum of Photography. It bears the signature of Daguerre, the inventor, and the seal of Giroux, the manufacturer. It is an example of the first camera commercially produced.
